This provides an exciting opportunity for those individuals who possess the necessary skills and commitment to support one or more of our academies at a local level by becoming a Member of an AAC.

These are vital roles as they provide Headteachers with the necessary support and expertise, and at times simply a sounding board, enabling Headteachers and their leadership teams to continue to provide the very best for the children and young people in our care.

The Trust Board has determined that AACs will consist of:-

- Two parent members elected
- One staff member elected
- Six members appointed by the Trust for their relevant expertise and ability to advise

Completing the form

- From time to time, the Trustees may seek a candidate with specific/key skills to enhance an area of weakness e.g. someone with a finance background to enhance the finance and accountancy expertise or someone with a Human Resources background to enhance the HR, personnel or employment law expertise for an individual academy.
- Whilst we are looking for some specific expertise, individuals without this should also consider joining us since full training will be provided from the Trust and a lack of knowledge should not be a barrier for people willing to serve and help us in this very important work.
